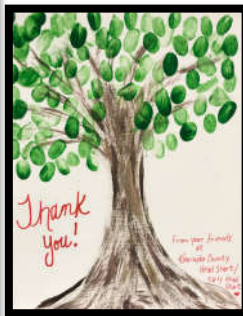

Many traditional decorations convey the meaning of Christmas. Write the words on the notecards to the right to complete the words. Then write the keyword letters in order to complete the candle.




Make some Christmas candles to remember Jesus, the Light of the world.

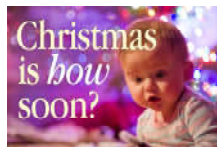
