Trimble and our Conference Superintendent Dr. Marti Lundy. Also, over the next couple of months, we will be sharing with you through weekly worship and outreach emails what we are hearing from you and from the Holy Spirit and continuing to invite feedback as you pray and listen. I also hope that you will plan to be a part of an important gathering Saturday, February 26th 9-11am at our amazing Connection Campus as we meet to hear and discuss where we are sensing God leading us, and meet those who are helping lead in the ministry of the church at our All-Church Annual Retreat. In these corporate settings of prayer it always amazes me how the Spirit of God speaks to our hearts as we listen.

I love that there is such a mosaic-like array of thoughts and ideas both in our congregation and our leadership that may sound like a cacophony of noise at first hearing. As we do the intentional, at times hard work of listening to each other and the Holy Spirit, I am so excited to see what God has in store for us. Two things I am certain of with every fiber of my being are that God has really good plans for us as a church to be a transformational light and presence of the love of Jesus to a broken, hurting and dying world; and that God through the power of the Holy Spirit in us is able to do abundantly more than we could ever imagine bringing healing and hope as we humbly surrender ourselves to God.

For the future of the ministry of Warsaw First United Methodist Church I believe it will take all of us intentionally and daily giving ourselves to God, being filled with the Holy Spirit, listening to the Spirit's leading, standing firm on God's Word enduring the stuff of life, keeping fixed on Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith and answering his call to Mission.

#### Bashor Children's Home began nearly 100


years ago as the Bashor Deaconess Orphanage for boys near Goshen, Indiana, on land donated to the Methodist Episcopal Church by John and Emaline Bashor. Around 1970, Bashor evolved from a traditional orphanage to a provider of professional residential treatment services. In 1974, Bashor began admitting girls into residential care. While continuing the affiliation with the United Methodist Church, Bashor has expanded services over the years to provide "Help for Today and Hope for Tomorrow" to troubled children and their families in collaboration with a number of agencies and through a variety of programs including education, residential treatment, community based services and therapeutic foster care. Most recently, Bashor opened Abby Thomas House and the Welch/ Innomed Residential Building in January 2022 to provide shelter and intensive therapy for teen-aged girls rescued from human trafficking.




