At JOE's Kids, "special children receive physical, occupational, and speech therapy in order to help them reach their maximal level of



independence in the areas of gross motor skills and mobility, fine motor skills, sensory processing, self-care, feeding and swallowing, and speech and language.... Appropriate therapy from a young age can have a profound impact on a child's development and ability to function independently later in life." Care is provided to children (from birth to 18 years) with a wide variety of diagnoses including autism, sensory processing disorder, hypotonia, cerebral palsy, Down Syndrome as well as many other genetic and developmental disorders. Joe's Kids is a non-profit organization that is able to bill Medicaid and commercial insurances for services; however, those amounts do not cover all of the operating costs of providing services. Donations will assist families with the financial burden of caring for their special children.
